Cover that Cake with Colorful Berries



This covers those "large" yarn cakes make by using hand-winders. Easy to modify by trying it on your cake. My cakes are about 3.5 inches tall by 14 inches in circumference.

Materials

- DK or worsted weight wool
- Two Size 8 (5 mm) 12-inch circular needles or size needed to obtain gauge.
 Notes: 1. Any size cable will work on the circulars if you don't mind hanging cables. 2. Substitute if you like to use double pointed needles.
- Size 4 dpns for icord

Gauge

4 stitches = 1 inch 5 rows = 1 inch Gauge is not really critical.

Abbreviations

p = purl
 k = knit
 k2tog = knit 2 stitches together
 s1wyib = slip one stitch with yarn held to the back of the work
 y0 = yarn over

Pattern Stitches

Crossed Braid (multiples of 4)

Row 1: *p1, s1wyib, k1, yo, pass slipped stitch over the knit1 and yo, p1* repeat across row

Row 2: * p1, k2, p1* repeat across row

Top

With circular needles and Old Norwegian Cast On method, or use long tail, CO 48 sts. Place 24 sts on each circular needle. Join into the round*.

Row 1: Purl Row 2: Knit

Row 3: k2, yo, k2tog

Row 4 & 5: k

Middle

Start the **Crossed Braid** pattern. Continue for 25 rows, about 5.5 inches.

Base

Row 1: *k6, k2tog* - 6 times

Row 2: knit

Row 3: *k5, k2tog* - 6 times

Row 4: knit

Row 5: *k4, k2tog* - 6 times

Row 6: knit

Row 7: *k3, k2tog* - 6 times

Row 8: knit

Row 9: *k2, k2tog* - 6 times

Row 10: knit

Row 11: *k1, k2tog* - 6 times

Row 12: knit

Row 13: *k2tog* - 6 times Row 14: *k2tog* - 3 times

Finish

Cut yarn and then thread through the three remaining stitches, pull tight to close circle. Weave in all ends.

Using Size 4 dpns, cast on 3 stitches and make a 20 inch icord. The icord can be longer if you like to walk while knitting so you can carry the yarn. Thread the icord through the eyelets. Tie each end of the icord for a tidier finish.

*Note: I like to use the Cat Bordhi method of join. It can be found on the Internet. I don't end up with a starting hole if I use this method.
